

## Standards-Based Report Cards

### Overview

Standards can be entered as a final grade via the gradebook OR they can be calculated from the results of several assignments tied to the standard(s) in question. Careful work should be done in advance to decide on the standards, enter/import them into PowerSchool and then work can be done on the reports. Traditionally the reporting is through Object Reports which can be laborious and requires coding all the standards by hand. The newer ReportWorks function can also report on standards, with the advantage of being able to list all standards without pre-defining them on the report. However, ReportWorks has not had overwhelming adoption and many users find it difficult to learn how to create them.
